Jersey City-The Hudson County Board of Commissioners approved the County of Hudson to accept Emergency Temporary Appropriation Funds from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Ryan White HIV Emergency Relief Supplemental Grant totaling **\$1,639,095** for fiscal year 2023.

The purpose of the program is to provide services that include outpatient, ambulatory medical care, essential support services, medical case management services and other core medical and social services programs for those living in Hudson County with HIV/AIDS.

The following Emergency Temporary Appropriation Funds from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services will be used for the following: **Carepoint Hoboken University Medical Center**, Medical Case Management, \$644,477, Emergency Assistance, \$41,162, Outpatient Ambulatory Health Services, \$229,333, Medical Transportation, \$2,000, **Robert Wood Johnson Barnabas Health Jersey City Medical Center**, Medical Case Management, \$643,087, Emergency Assistance, \$50,000, Medical Transportation, \$8,000, **Hudson County Administration**, \$21,036.

The program will run from March 1, 2022 to February 28, 2023.

Board Chairman Anthony Vainieri and The Board of Commissioners are committed to providing the needed financial services, support services, referral services, and prevention services to the residents of Hudson County who are living with HIV/AIDS.
