AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 368-6-2022
TO DEOBLIGATE AND REALLOCATE FUNDS
TO VENDORS FOR THE COUNTINUATION
OF WORKFIRST NEW JERSEY SERVICES
(\$347,226.00)

WHEREAS, by way of Resolution No. 368-6-2022, this Board approved the amendment of Resolution No. 124-3-2022 which deobligated and reallocated funds for the continuation of WorkFirst New Jersey services; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 368-6-2022 further approved a no-cost extension to the educational services provider contracts for the WorkFirst New Jersey Program; and

WHEREAS, these contracts were awarded through a fair and open competitive contracting process pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development granted a no-cost extension to the Hudson County/Jersey City Workforce Development Board for the WorkFirst New Jersey Program; and

WHEREAS, this no-cost extension will extend the original contract period from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022 to July 1, 2021 through October 31, 2022; and

WHEREAS, this no-cost extension will allow additional time for clients to continue participating in educational training programs with the contracted vendors; and

WHEREAS, these WorkFirst New Jersey Program funds must be fully expended by December 31, 2022; and

WHEREAS, under Resolution No. 124-3-2022, Resolution No. 511-9-2021 was amended to deobligate and reallocate funds to WorkFirst New Jersey educational service providers; and

WHEREAS, under Resolution No. 511-9-2021, Resolution No. 460-8-2021 was amended to reallocate funds from the Department of Family Services and reallocate those funds to the Hudson County/Jersey City Workforce Development Board; and

WHEREAS, under Resolution No. 460-8-2021, funds from the New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development were awarded to educational services providers for the WorkFirst New Jersey Program; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Family Services now wishes to amend Resolution No. 368-6-2022 to deobligate and reallocate funds to educational services vendors; and

WHEREAS, the funds to be deobligated and reallocated are in the amount of **THREE HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED TWENTY-SIX DOLLARS AND 00/100 (\$347,226.00)**; and

WHEREAS, the recommendations are consistent with the WorkFirst New Jersey regulations in the stated amounts for the period of July 1, 2021 to October 31, 2022 as follows:
