**Hudson County Board of Commissioners authorized resolution to accept additional ESG-CV funding from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for \$1,044,685.50**

**Jersey City**-The Hudson County Board of Commissioners authorized resolution to accept additional ESG-CV funding from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for \$1,044,685.50.

The grant will start September 22, 2022 and will run through June 30, 2024.

The funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) were awarded to Hudson County in an additional estimated amount of \$1,044,685.50 of reallocated funds from the Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG) program CARES Act (ESG-CV) appropriation. This is authorized by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES). Reallocated ESG-CV funds are to be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19) among individuals and families who are experiencing homelessness or receiving homeless assistance; and to support additional homeless assistance and homelessness prevention activities to mitigate the impacts of COVID-19.

These reallocated funds were recaptured from other grantees throughout the State who did not meet HUD's expenditure deadlines and are being made available to Hudson County. HUD's award to Hudson County of additional ESG-CV funds is a true testament to the Division's ability to administer programs for the most vulnerable populations in Hudson County.

Chairman Anthony Vainieri and the Board of Commissioners are committed to providing the services necessary to ensure the health and welfare of Hudson County residents that are impacted by COVID-19.

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
