Hudson County Commissioners approved over \$1,815,375.47 and extensions to 3 Open Space Trust Grantees for numerous open Space Acquisitions, Park Improvements and Historic Preservation Projects throughout Hudson County

Hudson County- The Hudson County Board of Commissioners approved over \$1,815,375.47 and extensions to 3 Open Space Trust Grantees for numerous open space acquisitions, park improvements and historic preservation projects throughout Hudson County.

The Town of Secaucus was awarded funds for Schmidts Woods Park Improvement. They were granted a 1-year extension.

The Town of Secaucus was awarded funds for a project which came in under budget. The funds \$967,000 will be utilized for the Millridge Road Field Complex. They were granted a 1-year extension.

The City of Union City was awarded funds for the acquisition of 4100 Palisades Avenue in the amount of \$271,525. They were granted a 1-year extension.

The Town of Guttenberg reprogramed funds from 127 71St (all access park) in the amount of \$142,413.90 to support the installation of a dog run, fencing and landscaping at Guttenberg Memorial Park.

The Town of Harrison reprogramed funds from Harrison Library in the amount of \$75,700.80. The funds will support the creation of a dog run at Cape May Street Park.

The Town of Harrison reprogramed funds from Harrison Courts in the amount of \$40,553 to Cape May Street Park Dog Run. The funds will support the creation of a dog run.

The Township of Weehawken reprogramed funds for Weehawken South Park Project in the amount of \$250,000. The funds will be used to connect the pedestrian bridge Pier B to Weehawken South Park.

Board Chairman Anthony Romano and the members of the Board of Commissioners are committed to providing the necessary resources needed to assist communities to make capital improvements to parks, acquire open space and preserve historic sites in their towns or cities within Hudson County.
