Historic Preservation Projects throughout Hudson
County**

Hudson County- The Hudson County Board of Commissioners approved over \$4,005,534.14 and extensions to 13 Open Space Trust Grantees for numerous open space acquisitions, park improvements and historic preservation projects throughout Hudson County.

The City of Bayonne was awarded funds for a several projects which came under budget. The following received extensions for one year:

Francis G. Fitzpatrick Park Project, Improvements to 28th Street Park, Improvements to Russell Golding Park Phase 1 & 2.

The Town of Harrison was awarded funds for a project which came under budget. The following projects were given one-year extensions: Waterfront Cape May Street Park/Walkway, Cape May Park Development,

The Borough of East Newark was awarded funds for a project which came under budget. The East Newark Recreation Center was given a one-year extension.

The City of Hoboken was awarded funds for City Hall Preservation and the Hoboken Cove and Boathouse in the amount of \$850,000. The following projects were given one-year extensions: Hoboken Cove & Boathouse, Northwest Resiliency Park, Northwest Resiliency Park Phase 2.

The City of Jersey City was given an extension of one year for the Reservoir 3 Historic Structures Stabilization Project.

The Town of Kearny was given an extension of one year for the Harvey Field Improvements in the amount of \$500,000.

The Township of West New York was given an extension of one year for Miller Park Improvements in the amount of \$500,000.

The Town of Guttenberg was awarded funds for Guttenberg and North Bergen Waterfront Park. The remaining funds of \$57,910.72 will be reprogrammed to Veterans Park for bathroom renovations.

Board Chairman Anthony Romano and the members of the Board of Commissioners are committed to providing the necessary resources needed to assist communities to make capital improvements to parks, acquire open space and preserve historic sites in their towns or cities within Hudson County.
