Hudson County Board of Commissioners approved a contract for allocation of funds to various agencies by the County of Hudson for American Rescue Plan Act, totaling \$664,580.

Hudson County- The Hudson County Board of Commissioners approved a contract for allocation of funds to various agencies by the County of Hudson for American Rescue Plan Act, totaling \$664,580.

The County has been advised that it will receive \$664,580 in stimulus funds pursuant to the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Plan Act also known as the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (the “ARP”).

The ARP funds will be used for the benefit of Hudson County and its municipalities and eligible agencies to assist community-based organizations with an established history of assisting residents with the acquisition of food commodities. Funding opportunities will support costs associated with the establishment of a mobile pantry, overhead costs associated with managing a food pantry/distribution site and the creation of mini food pantries at non-profit agencies.

The Term of the grant runs from September 15, 2023, through December 31, 2025.

The following agencies are receiving funds under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Mobile Food Pantry, Hunger Free Unity in the Community, \$181,250, Overhead Costs for Newly Established Food Distribution and Pantry Sites, SALT Foundation, \$96,666, Monumental Baptist Church, \$96,666, The Food Brigade, \$96,666, Creation of Public Access “Free Mini Pantries”, Kismet of Kings, \$48,333, HOPES Community Action Partnership, \$48,333, Sarah’s Daughter’s, \$48,333, and Monumental Baptist Church, \$48,333.

Board Chairman Anthony Romano and the Hudson County Board of Commissioners committed allocated the sum of \$664,580 from the ARP funds to various agencies to provide needed services to County residents.
