Jersey City-The Hudson County Board of Commissioners approved the County of Hudson to apply and accept funds, if awarded, in the amount of \$11,844,567.44 from NOAA Transformational Habitat Restoration and Coastal Resilience Grants for Lincoln Park Wetlands Restoration.

The 36-month project will result in the restoration of 31 acres of coastal wetlands, edge enhancement for a 1.3-acre tidal pond, 4.69 acres of upland plantings, pond enhancement for a 4.3-acre pond, the addition of a vegetative buffer, pathways, along with related outreach, education, and monitoring activities. The project scope advances and supports various local, regional, and state level goals related to habitat restoration and enhancing coastal resilience.

The anticipated start for this project is January 1, 2025, with a completion date of December 31, 2027.

Board Chairman Anthony Romano, Hudson County Commissioner Bill O’Dea and the rest of the Board of Commissioners are not only safety conscious but also realize the need to upgrade the park to make it user friendly.
