12 ordinances for adoption. I will now turn it over to
13 the Administration.

14 MR. ANTUN: Mr. Chairman, I have no
15 additional.

16 THE CLERK: I have nothing, Chairman.

17 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: No. Any of the
18 directors?

19 COMMISSIONER O'DEA: I've got
20 something.

21 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Go, go, go.

22 COMMISSIONER O'DEA: Jerry first.

23 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Go ahead, Jerry.

24 COMMISSIONER WALKER: No. Bill's got
25 it. Come on.

1 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Go ahead, Bill.
2 Go.

3 COMMISSIONER O'DEA: So I just wanted
4 to put on the record that, I don't know if you all
5 received a letter concerning a County employee that
6 was hired. That should, I hope, well, maybe the
7 only sense -- well, I'm glad I did what I did with
8 it.

9 So I received a letter concerning a County
10 employee that was hired approximately six years ago,
11 and I think at the time as a building maintenance
12 worker, now he's a carpenter or something. And they
13 provided information on the person's criminal
14 background, including a news article concerning when
15 the individual pled guilty to a certain offense.
16 There were certain allegations in the letter
17 concerning that individual's access to the
18 Prosecutor's offices and Sheriff's offices. So I
19 provided that.

20 When I ascertained that they didn't work
21 in either of those offices, I provided that
22 information to Ralph, who's the deputy of Denise's
23 department. They confirmed to me that that
24 individual does not have access to any of those
25 spaces. And he works out, I guess, at Meadowview.

1 And there are Prosecutors and Sheriffs. I guess 911
2 is out there. But that individual does not have
3 access to any of those spaces. I don't know if
4 there's any way to determine whether or not he ever
5 went into any of them. That's probably beyond the
6 scope. But I think in today's day and age, you can
7 figure it out going forward.

8 And that the most important issue is that
9 that individual disclosed their record when they
10 were submitted their application to be hired by the
11 County. I guess they're -- just from the office, I
12 guess they were a County resident when they got
13 hired?

14 DIRECTOR D'ALESSANDRO: Yes.

15 COMMISSIONER O'DEA: Okay. So I just
16 want to put that on the record because obviously as
17 an elected official, I have certain obligations, and
18 I expect that the person who sent that might come to
19 Thursday's meeting as a speaker so. And again, they
20 want the person dismissed, et cetera, et cetera.
21 But the key issues where I know you have to disclose
22 if you have a record, that in itself is not a
23 disqualifying. So for some positions it would be.

24 MR. BATTISTA: But is the "Ban the
25 Box" statute? Right. So it depends upon what it

1 is. That may impact what you have to disclose and
2 what you've disclosed.

3 COMMISSIONER O'DEA: But again, this
4 was six years ago. It would predate that. But so
5 had they not disclosed it, and someone did a
6 background check and didn't notify them, that would
7 have been a problem. But I just want to put that on
8 the record because obviously that was sent to me. I
9 assumed it was sent to everybody. Did you get it?
10 Okay. So all the people got it too. So then it's
11 confirmed he has no access, correct? That he's in
12 sensitive areas?

13 MR. BATTISTA: Mr. Chairman, I'm not
14 aware of any of this. I can't address it.

15 COMMISSIONER O'DEA: No. I received
16 it yesterday. I received it or I came up here on
17 the weekend to get my mail, opened it, knew there
18 was a caucus today, reached out, made a copy of it,
19 sent it over to Ralph Sax, actually spoke to his
20 supervisor, I guess, Dennis Keach (ph). And again,
21 the rest is just for people. If that individual
22 comes to us, they'll answer the question. Okay. It
23 could have been a couple of weeks ago. I guess so,
24 just on the other day.

25 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Jerry, we'll turn

1 it over to you. Bob, you said something? Bobby, go
2 ahead if you want.

3 COMMISSIONER BASELICE: No, I'm good.

4 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Jerry?

5 COMMISSIONER WALKER: Yeah. Last, I
6 guess our last caucus meeting, I mentioned that I'm
7 getting his honored tomorrow at the Big East
8 tournament. We got bumped from the 6:30 to nine,
9 but that's a whole nother story. But just to let you
10 know, tomorrow on Fox, Channel 5 at 9:40, between
11 9:30 and 9:40, I'm going be at the Madison Square
12 Garden. We're going be live. They're going do an
13 interview with me live. And I'm going to have a
14 spend an evening with my beautiful wife, my son in
15 New York City. So we're going to have a good time.
