

ABOUT HUDSON COUNTY VISION ZERO SAFETY ACTION PLAN

Hudson County is dedicated to creating safer streets for all who live, work, and travel in our communities. The County has set a bold goal: **eliminate all traffic-related fatalities and serious injuries on County roads by 2034.**

To reach this goal, Hudson County has developed the Safety Action Plan - a roadmap that outlines priorities and strategies to improve the safety of pedestrians, cyclists, transit riders, and drivers.

Here are just a few of the steps Hudson County is taking to achieve **zero traffic deaths**:

- **Community Engagement:** Ongoing outreach efforts to identify local concerns and garner project feedback.
- **Complete Streets Checklist:** Guides County roadway projects to ensure projects accommodate all road users.
- **Demonstration Projects:** Short-term, low-cost projects to inform future, long-term infrastructure investments.
- **High Injury Network (HIN):** Map of streets with a high frequency of fatal or severe crashes used to prioritize safety improvements.
- **Safe Routes to School:** Improving routes to school to ensure that children can walk, bike, and roll safely.
- **Vision Zero Task Force:** Coordinating implementation of the Safety Action Plan through collaboration with the County, agencies, municipalities, and community.

Action Plan Highlights

The Hudson County Vision Zero Safety Action Plan **identifies the agencies responsible for each action, establishes time-frames,** and **outlines performance measures** for the County to evaluate implementation progress.

The Plan is comprised of **20 strategies** and **90+ actions** which are organized into **four guiding themes**.

A Change the Culture of Traffic Safety

What this Means: Promoting shared responsibility and addressing the root causes of dangerous driving behavior.

Project Highlight: Launching the Rapid Response Team to investigate fatal and serious crashes



C Partner & Collaborate

What this Means: Creating multi-jurisdictional projects and policies to foster collaboration and share best practices.

Project Highlight: Collaborating through the Hudson County Vision Zero Task Force



B Build Streets that are Safe for Everyone

What this Means: Eliminating severe crash risks and delivering accessible transportation networks for people of all ages and abilities.

Project Highlight: Expanding the protected bike network to physically separate cyclists from traffic

What this Means: Advocating and investing in transit and other safe, affordable, and sustainable transportation choices.
