Hudson County Motors plans to maintain the Cinelli office building as part of our sales offices and parts distribution, and then add 24 bays for truck repairs. There are sales of the large tractor trailers, rigs. They would have a truck display on Old Secaucus Road, and the iron storage will be converted into parking and storage of trucks, new trucks and trucks waiting to be repaired.

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Access will be maintained exactly as it is, which access located on Secaucus Road. The existing parking in front of the Cinelli building will be maintained. Some things will be added, the L-shaped addition for parking, repaving the areas behind and in front for parking. Additionally, there is a small office space located on the north end of the lot, that will also be untouched. That's about it in a nutshell. Does anybody have question? CHAIRWOMAN BETTINGER: Basically,

MR. MORRIS: Yes, they're purchasing the Cinelli property.

MR. KEMP: The actual business is that truck sales, and again, they're called Mack trucks, that size. There will also leasing the trucks and repair and also parts and services. What

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purchased this site, that's actually three parcels, and we're in the process or will be in the process of moving, just transferring locations.

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CHAIRWOMAN BETTINGER: That means that the trucks will be out in County Road?

MR. MORRIS: Yes. We have done a complete traffic analysis for the NJSEA and Secaucus. I think we also gave it to the County. It's a fairly minimal impact. The operation is already in Secaucus, and compared to Cinelli, it's a decrease.

MR. KEMP: Under Meadowlands regulations we had an impact assessment, and you have to pay a fee. It actually turned out when we submitted that, we were actually less so we didn't have to pay the Commission. We didn't have to pay any fees.

MR. MORRIS: As an example, Cinelli was bringing in probably one truck every two or three minutes. This was a very fairly intense operation.

MR. RYPKEMA: Our operation is very quiet.

CHAIRWOMAN BETTINGER: Just one question with regard to traffic, if you don't mind.

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Is there a traffic light in that intersection? 1 2. MR. MORRIS: The traffic light is in 3 the intersection, and it's a smart traffic light. So all Secaucus Road, it's actuated on Secaucus Road 4 5 so the light will give greens to Secaucus all the If one car comes into here, it will turn 6 green for Secaucus Road for a short period. If it's ten cars stacked, it turns green for a longer 8 9 period. 10 CHAIRWOMAN BETTINGER: Our Board was 11 influential in having that light installed. 12 COMMISSIONER MALAVASI: That 13 intersection is part of the adaptive system. It's 14 really not under -- we don't regulate it on the 15 County. We have an agreement with them. 16 monitor and regulate the timing. 17 MR. MORRIS: I was looking for the 18 word, the adaptive system. It's a variable signal. 19 It's probably state-of-the-art. This is the 20 existing Cinelli building, which will have some 21 additional work, and this will be truck bays. 2.2 COMMISSIONER MEHTA: And your parking 23 area, the parking you have in the back of the 2.4 building, so employees or everybody is going to park

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there?

MR. MORRIS: Most of the employees,
and they may be trucks out waiting for service
parked back here. It's mostly employees.

COMMISSIONER MEHTA: And you also have parking in front, and everybody uses the parking spots in the back?

MR. MORRIS: There is employee parking in the front of which exists, and this would be both truck storage and some employee parking along the back by the green.

CHAIRWOMAN BETTINGER: How many employees do you have?

MR. RYPKEMA: We employ 51 employees right now. We're making a lateral move, and then aside from a few of our employees, we're going to maintain that parking.

MR. KEMP: If you give the Board the benefit, we had discussed that it's mostly a sales office, and employees are on the road?

MR. RYPKEMA: We operate a Class A vehicle dealership, which is slightly different than automotive retail where traffic comes to the dealership. Most of my salespeople for this business, they're constantly on the road with the customer, so it's almost opposite you would
