17	CHAIRWOMAN BETTINGER: I would like
18	to acknowledge for the record that Commissioner
19	Walker has arrived.
20	MR. ALONSO: Good evening, Madam
21	Chair. Alvaro Alonso from the law firm, Alonso &
22	Navarette, on behalf of the applicant. The Board
23	may recall this application, which was before you.
24	We had received site plan approvals from the City of
25	Union City, and came here for the final approvals.

The County had some partial modifications to the County road with regard to the modification. That application which was before the Union City Planning Board just to get that approved. In the meantime we're before the Board for the sewer connection. So that's only limited scope of this application.

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I have to Mr. Costa, the engineer.

MR. COSTA: Madam Chair, Members of the Board, good evening. I apologize I'm not dressed. I was freezing to death, and this is as good as it's going to get tonight.

(The witness is sworn.)

MR. CURLEY: Would you please state your name for the record --

MR. COSTA: Absolutely. For the record, Robert Louis Costa, C-o-s-t-a, 325 South River Street in Hackensack, New Jersey.

Madam Chair, very quickly. Excuse me, I'm a little sick, like 35 percent. We came here for the approval that you guys graciously granted us. From there we went to North Hudson for the sewer connection. Since that time we designed our pump station. Even though it would fall down the hill into the street facility, and back and forth, we're now going have the pump station on the property. I

have chalk lines that run through the bottom of the property. They required us to do test pits. We brought machinery on-site. Weehawken stopped us from going in there. That turned into a whole rigmarole with the Mayor of Weehawken, so on and so forth. Back to the sewer authority, again, designs, and now ultimately they have approved it, obviously subject to this connection.

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We have designed for a hundred-year storm to capture it on-site, and a six-inch pipe that will connect into your storm drain. What we are also going to put in at the request, do you want to have this marked?

MR. ALONSO: A-1.

(Exhibit A-1 is received and marked for Identification by the Reporter.)

MR. ALONSO: For the record, A-1.

For the record it I'm going to ask you to identify.

MR. COSTA: Absolutely. Basically this is what the sewer authority requires or requested us to put in, which we will do. This is a computerized valve. So basically, a large pipes are underneath the apartment structure. The storm comes in, the rain is picked up by the roof leaders,

drainage on the entire job. All that water is

1	stored in those pipes for a hundred-year storm,
2	one-hundred percent based on the impervious. It
3	might actual be a little bit more. That water gets
4	stored there. In the event that the sewer authority
5	pipes cannot take that, it stays there until the
6	storm passes through, and this is
7	computer-controlled. So there's going to be an
8	actual valve that's controlled by North Hudson that
9	will release the water when it's okay to do so.
10	In the event this fails, there is a fail

In the event this fails, there is a fail safe system that there's an overflow. Then you go down to the bottom of the hill to the seepage pit. So basically from what I understand, I'm not sure how many of these are planned. This is, I guess, is going to try to stop.

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CHAIRWOMAN BETTINGER: Mr. Costa, so I understand, could you explain who is putting this in?

MR. COSTA: We will put it in, and when I say "we," the applicant. The contractor will put it in. Once it's installed we hand it off to the sewer authority. We control it. Basically from my understanding, and you can jump in any anytime, Mr. Voinier.

MR. VOINIER: It's a pretty good

Basically, there is a

1 idea.

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3 company that monitors storm forecasting, and so this will be monitored by an external company that the 4 5 data brought back to the sewer authority. 6 Basically, what they're trying to do is trying to 7 stop it. You know, the combined system, the rain comes in and overflows and goes into the Hudson 8 River. If they put enough of these in, they could 10 control that flow and outlet it slowly after the 11 storm passes through. Theoretically, it sounds like 12 a great idea. I think the horse ran around the 13 track quite a few times; when we put enough in, that 14 they should actually see something happen again. 15 COMMISSIONER MALAVASI: The only 16 thing you turn over to them is control of the valve? 17 MR. COSTA: That's it. 18 COMMISSIONER MALAVASI: You will have 19 a maintenance agreement of some sort. The MUA is in 20 control of the valve as part of your application.

MR. COSTA:

MR. COSTA: No problem.

So that maintenance treatment, we'll maintain just a

COMMISSIONER MALAVASI: So that we

know that's being maintained. One of the concerns I

have with a valve is when you put a valve on a stormwater systems, they sit there for five years, and nobody touches them. Then if we need them, they don't open. This is different because this is a computer-controlled valve that will be opened and closed. Even if it's not needed, there will be someone opening and closing on a regular basis so when they need it, it should hopefully work.

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MR. COSTA: Even if this doesn't work and it's stuck open, the largest pipe that comes into this system is six inches. Your system is twelve inches, so there's even a choke no matter what. If this again jammed there's another system to pond that water.

MR. VOINIER: The water builds up, and the MUA through their computer monitor says we will open the flow.

COMMISSIONER MALAVASI: Hoboken is doing a lot of this type of thing throughout the city. We put in two chambers on Garden Street. It's not a machine. It's just a small structure to control overflow, but it fill with the water and slowly release into the combined sewer system. There is lot of these planned in Hoboken.

MR. COSTA: Again, hopefully. Even

if it's a test, it's worth looking at. It's worth investing because of the buzzword because if you're not manually sending somebody to turn the valve or to maintain the valve, this can be done with sensors and everything else, obviously much better. It's a fail safe system.

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COMMISSIONER MALAVASI: The conflict is it's always open. It shouldn't get open during the storm. If there's a failure, the failure would be it would open.

MR. COSTA: Right, right. Even if it fails, it shouldn't fail, but if it fails it will flood the street. The overflow is piped into the bottom of the hill in a series of seepage pits, so there's additional storage capacity at the bottom in the event that that would happen. In the event that it doesn't shut property, the most that you can have is the six-inch choke flow coming out of the system.

COMMISSIONER MALAVASI: And that overflow, we never see more than that. The engineer did not review drainage through because drainage, you'll know where it's going to go. The overflow system is the same way. If there's a failure all of the water goes down the hill.

MR. VOINIER: The only question I

have is if the North Hudson Sewer Authority has you with a six-inch orifice on the County system, you're feeding the six-inch pipe into a flow. I know they say the system we're assuming will always work, even when you're releasing during dry periods. I don't know if you have a six-inch going into twelve. Do have a problem with that?

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MR. COSTA: No.

MR. VOINIER: That's the only remaining question always to overflow. It works in dry conditions, and if anything malfunctions, you want to say it is fixable.

MR. COSTA: Really, the technology is that good. You're going to see a lot more of this coming before you.

CHAIRWOMAN BETTINGER: And I will be knowledgeable about it.

MR. COSTA: I didn't patent this or trademark it, otherwise I wouldn't be here today.

CHAIRWOMAN BETTINGER: Do you have any other questions?

MR. VOINIER: Not really. You're required to get that deed. You'll submit everything that we asked for. We have no problem with this. He's pretty much addressed all of the comments.
