**AMENDING RESOLUTION NOS. 453-7-2017, 545-9-2017, 546-9-2017  
131-3-2018 AND 154-3-2018  
TO DE-OBLIGATE, RE-ALLOCATE AND AWARD ADDITIONAL  
DEPARTMENT OF LABOR FUNDS TO SERVICE VENDORS  
FOR THE CONTINUATION OF WORKFIRST NEW JERSEY SERVICES  
JULY 1, 2017 TO JUNE 30, 2018  
(\$598,770.00)**

**WHEREAS**, by way of Resolution No. 453-7-2017, this Board awarded funds from the New Jersey State Department of Labor and Workforce Development for the Workfirst New Jersey Welfare Reform Program to service providers; and

**WHEREAS**, by way of Resolution No. 545-9-2017, this Board approved a Non- Fair and Open Professional Services contract with Eferon Solar Solutions for Workfirst New Jersey Occupational Training; and

**WHEREAS**, by way of Resolution No. 546-9-2017, this Board approved year 2 of a Fair and Open contract with Suits for Success for the Workfirst New Jersey Occupational Training; and

**WHEREAS**, by way of Resolution No. 131-3-2018, this Board de-obligated and re-allocated funds to vendors for Workfirst New Jersey services; and

**WHEREAS**, by way of Resolution No. 154-3-2018, this Board awarded additional funds to Eferon Solar Solutions for Professional Services for Workfirst New Jersey services; and

**WHEREAS**, the Director of Family Services now wishes to de-obligate, re-allocate and award additional funds to vendors for the continuation of Workfirst New Jersey Services, which service they have provided; and

**WHEREAS**, the de-obligated, re-allocation and award of additional funds are not subject to "Pay to Play" requirements as they emanated from a fair and open competitive process pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4.1, or were an exception under the Local Public Contracts Law at N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5(l) (a) (i); and

**WHEREAS**, the shift in funding represents the Department's ongoing effort to allocate funds to performing agencies and reduce funds that are awarded to underperforming agencies and the movement of funds also allows the Department to expend remaining funds and pay for services already provided by the vendors; and

**WHEREAS**, the contracts are for the period of July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018 and represent funding for various employment, basic education skills training, and job search readiness services to Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF), and General Assistance (GA) and Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP) clients; and

**WHEREAS**, the following recommendations are consistent with New Jersey regulations in the stated amounts:

WHEREAS, the amounts of funds being de-obligated and re-allocated is in the amount of **FIVE HUNDRED NINETY EIGHT THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED SEVENTY DOLLARS AND 00/100 (\$598,770.00)** and the Director of Finance and Administration has certified in writing that funds are available for this purpose in Account Nos. 02-213-40-740-17 (\$318,690.00) and 02-213-40-741-18 (\$250,000.00); and

WHEREAS, part of the \$651,270.00 is the sum of **TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS AND 00/100 (\$250,000.00)** which funds will be accepted in a companion budget amendment resolution of this date and are part of the re-allocated funds to the various vendors; and

WHEREAS, the Local Public Contracts Law at N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1(q) permits the awarding of a contract for educational goods and services without public advertising for bids, and requires that the resolution and terms be available for public inspection.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Hudson, that:


1. The aforesaid recitals are incorporated herein as though fully set forth at length.
2. The Board hereby authorizes the County Executive, Thomas A. DeGise, or County Administrator, Abraham Antun, or Deputy County Administrator, David B. Drumeler, or their lawfully appointed designee, to execute any and all documents and take any and all actions necessary to complete and realize the intent and purpose of this Resolution.
3. The Board hereby approves the de-obligation, re-allocation and award of additional Department of Labor funds to vendors for the continuation of Workfirst New Jersey services.
4. The Board hereby approves the payment to educational services providers for Workfirst New Jersey services.
5. The Clerk to this Board shall attach a certified copy of this Resolution to the filed copies of Resolution Nos. 453-7-2017, 545-9-2017, 546-9-2017, 131-3-2018 and 154-3-2018.
6. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.
